Extraordinary Mothers

Every mom, is extraordinary. Where would we be without the women who God entrusted to be our mothers - the women who carried us, delivered us, nurtured us, instructed us, disciplined us, and loved us unconditionally by their example led us to the LORD?

The Bible tells us of several extraordinary mothers whose faith in God was undeterred; who trusted the LORD with all their hearts. Think about it for just a moment . . . without mothers who feared God and were willing to be used of Him, Moses may have never floated in a basket on the Nile River and Jesus may never have been born in Bethlehem. Here are just a few:

JOCHEBED: Moses' mother, risked everything to save her infant son's life. At the time of Moses' birth, the Egyptian Pharaoh demanded that midwives kill every Hebrew boy born in Egypt - something done in an effort to control

the Hebrew population. Jochebed hid Moses in a basket of bulrushes and set him afloat on the Nile River to preserve his life (*Exodus 2:3*). Even Pharaoh's own daughter disobeyed the decree when she found Moses in the basket and took pity on him, adopting him as her own child (*Exodus 2:5-10*). Moses was raised as the son of Pharaoh's daughter.

Jochebed made the sacrifice not only to ignore the Pharaoh's mandate and hide her son for three months, but to then selflessly release him so that he could survive and be cared for by the Pharaoh's daughter. In an amazing turn of events, Jochebed became Moses' nurse while Pharaoh's daughter raised him - an effort that kept her connected to her beloved son while he was a baby.

Exodus 2:9-10 (KJV) tells us what happened after Pharaoh's daughter discovered Moses in the basket on the Nile and hired Jochebed to nurse the boy:



“And Pharaoh's daughter said unto her, ‘Take this child away, and nurse it for

me, and I will give thee thy wages.’ And the woman took the child, and nursed it. And the child grew, and she brought him unto Pharaoh's daughter, and he became her son. And she called his name Moses: and she said, because I drew him out of the water.”

The Bible doesn't tell us if Jochebed lived to see her son be used of God as Moses led the Jews out of bondage from Egypt; at the parting of the Red Sea, or when he received God's Laws on Mount Sinai; but she was indeed a mother who feared God, risked everything to give her son life, and was used of God in a mighty way.

MARY: Jesus's mother, without a doubt, is the most well-known and revered woman in the Bible. The scriptures explain that God chose Mary to be Jesus' mother - granting her one of the most important and transformational roles in human history.

The gospel account in the Book of Luke is quite revealing. It shows the grace with which Mary took the startling news that she would be Christ's mother. The angel Gabriel appeared to Mary, who was a virgin at the time and betrothed to Joseph. Gabriel told Mary that she was “highly favored” and revealed that she would conceive and bear a son.

Mary questioned how pregnancy was possible and was initially troubled by the angel's appearance. But

once she learned of the reason for Gabriel's visit, she responded to the life-changing news with a heart that was fully open to God's will, by faith as recorded in Luke 1:29-38:

“And when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and cast in her mind what manner of salutation this should be. And the angel said unto her, ‘Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God. And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.”

“Then said Mary unto the angel, How shall this be, seeing I know not a man? And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God . . . And Mary said, Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word.”



Mary's reaction is a lesson in our own lives when we find ourselves faced with a difficult or challenging call from God. In this instance, Mary chose to trust and obey God by faith and faith alone . . . In God her Savior (vs. 47). She forfeited her reputation, and gladly endured the scorn and ridicule of others . . . an unmarried teenager, pregnant, disgraced . . . To bear the One full of grace and truth who would go to the cross for you and me.

MEMORIAL DAY REFLECTIONS







My prayer is that you are all encouraged and blessed by tuning into Sunday messages as well as enjoying our newsletter and sharing it with others as God leads.




