OUR “ABBA FATHER”

Father – there are few words that can call to mind such strong emotions and feelings from every direction — joy, love, gratefulness, sorrow, anger, laughter, regret, longing, fear, security, homesickness.

Father’s Day is traditionally a special time of family; a day set aside to honor and refresh childhood memories with our Dads. It is a happy time. We get to push the “pause button” on the mundane and take time to celebrate the special bond and joy we share with our Dads. Father’s Day provides children an opportunity to express love, honor, and respect for their fathers. The sentiment goes a long way in strengthening father-child relationships and the emotional and spiritual development of the children God has entrusted to our care. Father’s Day celebrates the vital role that fathers and father-like figures make in the lives of children. It is the perfect time for you and me to bless, honor, remember, and

appreciate the men God chose to be our earthly fathers – and that’s exactly what we do on Father’s Day.

The “flip side” to all this celebrating, of course, is that we live in an imperfect, broken world; thus, for many - Father’s Day can be a glaring reminder of loneliness, disappointment, painful memories, or no memories at all. For some, the day brings waves of grief because a beloved father or child is no longer alive to celebrate the day. For another, it’s a stark reminder of the neglect, abandonment, or abuse experienced at the hand of an earthly father. It can also be painful for the person who never even knew their Dad, for the man who longs to be a father, or for someone who shared no more than a distant, biological relationship with their father.

In his Father’s Day devotional titled, “Abba, Father,” from “Our Daily Bread,” Tim Gustafson, a father of 8, writes: “But for many, “Dad” is an incomplete concept. Where are we to turn if our fathers are gone, or they fail us, or even if they wound us?” That’s a question with no easy answer humanly speaking - especially if you have been hurt by a father or another man you trusted.

Regardless of the type of father you grew up with – or without – your view of God is influenced a great deal by the relationship you had with your father – good, bad, absent, or indifferent. That’s just how it is sometimes. Yet, if Father’s Day evokes negative feelings and memories for you, most people do not know why and are unaware of how you feel. People with like feelings can certainly understand why you’d rather just skip the day altogether. What’s the point in celebrating painful memories or no memories at all?

Thankfully, praise God, with a willing heart, we can meet Father’s Day with peace and joy regardless of the positive or negative feelings we might carry! By switching our focus from our earthly father to our heavenly Father, God “. . . will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus” (Philippians 4:7); not just Father’s Day but every day. By setting “... your minds on things above, not on earthly things ...” (Colossians 3:2) feelings deep inside can be replaced with joy and peace with God’s help. Jesus places a new song in your heart as you praise your heavenly Father for who He is.

Can you think of a better way to spend Father’s Day then to realize that the One who knew you before you were conceived (*see Jeremiah 1:4*) and knit you together in your mother's womb (*see Psalm 139:13*) is your Heavenly Father through the redemptive work of His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ?

As believers, access to our heavenly Father is through Jesus Christ alone. His sacrifice was the one and only price that could be paid for our redemption and

restoration into the family of His wonderful Father with so many promises too numerous to mention.

Here are just a few:

Nothing Will Ever Separate You From Christ and the Father’s Love - Romans 8:38-39

“For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

God the Father is our “Abba-Father” – Galatians 4:4-7

“But when the fullness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law, to redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father. Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.”

We really don’t need a designated “Father’s Day” on the calendar for our hearts to know that our “Abba Father’s” love for us is eternal. Contrary to our feelings – good or bad, God loves you and me as much as He loves His Son!

With humble hearts and pure adoration and thanksgiving, we bow before the King of Kings and Lord of Lords and proclaim, “Happy Father’s Day, Abba Father!”

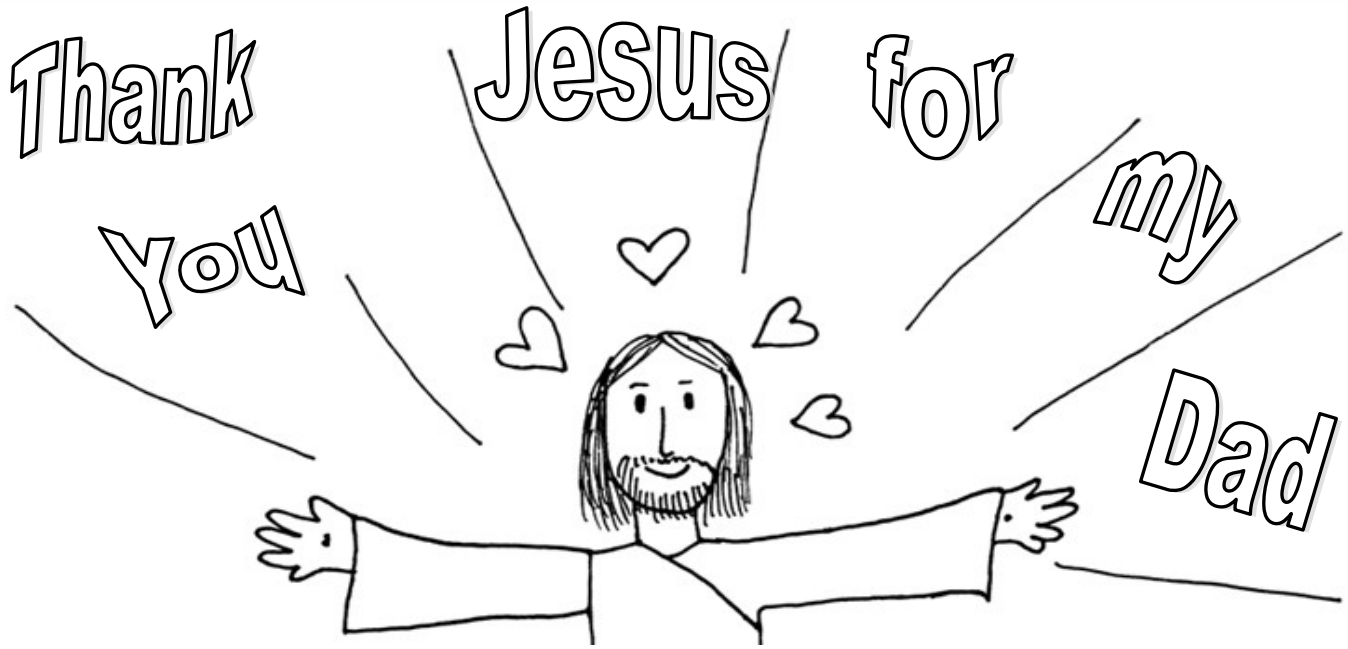

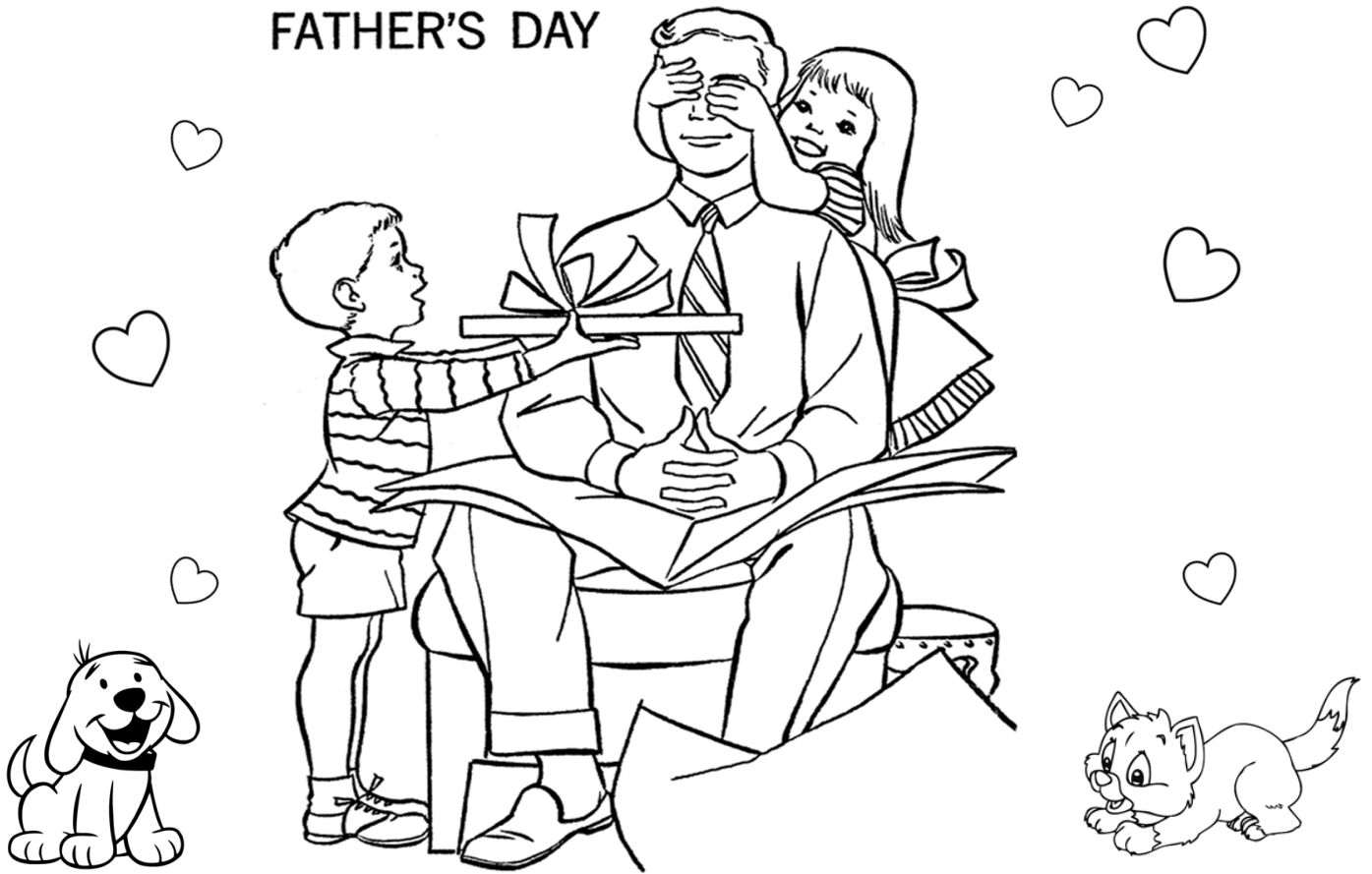

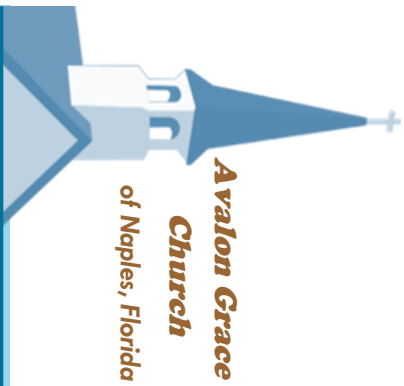
