The Apostle Paul as a Father

ood earthly fathers understand that raising children is more than passing along instruction and knowledge. A good father takes his responsibility very seriously and honors God by encouraging, comforting, teaching, and protecting their children entrusted to his care.

Likewise, our heavenly Father lovingly placed Paul in the Body of Christ as "spiritual father" according to the gospel of Jesus Christ. For example, Paul taught believers by love, grace, and gentleness, as fathers are taught to deal with their children:

Ephesians 6:4: "And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord."

1 Thessalonians 2:7: "But we were gentle among you, even as a nurse cherisheth her children:"

Paul, instructed by God the Father, lovingly communicated that which was given to him, by the Son: 1 Timothy 1:2: "Unto Timothy, my own son in the faith: Grace, mercy, and peace, from

God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord."

Paul spoke to "children" in an age appropriate manner according to their maturity:

1 Corinthians 3:1: "And I, brethren, could not speak unto you as unto spiritual, but as unto carnal, even as unto babes in Christ."

1 Corinthians 14:20:
"Brethren, be not children in understanding: howbeit in malice be ye children, but in understanding be men."

2 Corinthians 12:14:
"Behold, the third time I am ready to come to you; and I will not be burdensome to you: for I seek not yours, but you: for the children ought not to lay up for the parents, but the parents for the children."

Just as believers are to read the Word of God to grow and strengthen their faith, repetition is necessary for children - Galatians 4:19, "My little children, of whom I travail in birth again until Christ be formed in you,"

Children need to be warned of the dangers of being "of the world":

Ephesians 4:14, "That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive;"

It is doubtful we would have any of Paul's epistles if it were not for his heart as a father. They were written as letters from our heavenly Father to His children, through Paul, our apostle. By reading them we become the recipients of the same exhortation, comfort, and charge that Paul was giving his children in the faith. Paul was a living example of the grace given to him, for us to understand the grace given to us, as children of God awaiting our adoption (Ephesians 1:5) into our heavenly family.

How thankful we are to God for His Word through the Lord Jesus Christ who first gave His glorious and unmerited grace to Paul in this dispensation so our apostle could communicate God's grace given freely to us:

"For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast. For we are his workmanship; created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them." Ephesians 2:8-10


So God Made a Father

I need someone strong enough to open the tight seal of a jelly jar. Someone who is tall enough to put the angel on




top of the Christmas tree. And yet, I need someone who is gracious enough to let his son fish the best fishing hole or to let his daughter win at least one hand of rummy.
