What Does the World Need Now?

f you are a baby-boomer, you may have heard or even sung along with the 1965 hit song "What the World Needs Now is Love" by Jackie DeShannon. The song conveyed to us in the counter-culture of the 60's that what 'the world needs now is love – sweet love – it's the only thing that's there's just too little of!'

It surely sounds good enough, and considering all the hate, war, confusion, and conflict we live with today, couldn't we all use a little more love? What could possibly be wrong with more love? (1 Timothy 6:10)

Paul tells us that the Corinthians were living in love of fleshly indulgence (1 Corinthians 6:13-16). The world says, what's wrong with love and happiness if it doesn't harm anyone?

But our apostle Paul rightly called it sin that did not glorify God: "What? Know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's." (1 Corinthians 6: 19-20)

People who have not trusted in the death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of their sins can certainly love each other without God; living darkened lives in love and love pleasure more than God: "For if ye love them which love you, what thank have ye? For sinners also love those that love them." (Luke 6:32)

But the sad reality is that people all around us who reject Jesus Christ celebrate Valentine's Day with love, flowers, candy, romantic cards, and gifts across the world in darkness. And there is nothing wrong with celebrating Valentine's Day. However, the truth is that these loving people perish if they do not hear, know, or love the truth: "And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved." (2 Thessalonians 2:10). "And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil." (2 Timothy 3:14)

Love must be tempered by truth. That's what the world needs now! Without the truth all our loving words and deeds become worldly and worthless. You cannot have the truth without Christ: "In whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge." (Colossians 2:3)

Love is NOT the answer for the world. Only JESUS is. And only Jesus is pure love: "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8) "But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:15)

"Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth;" (1 Corinthians 13:6)

"Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it; that he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, that he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish." (Ephesians 5:25-27)

Valentine's Day is a day on the calendar set aside each year to express our love and appreciation for so many people who make our lives so blessed, special and complete! And that's a good thing! So with that, Happy Valentine's Day and Happy Leap Year too!!

A quick look at God's Word in the Bible reveals some compelling reasons:



Fulfillment of a God-given desire – David was overjoyed as the Ark of the Covenant was brought to Jerusalem. "And as the ark of the Lord came into

the City of David, Michal, Saul's daughter looked through a window, and saw King David *leaping* and dancing before the Lord." 2 Samuel 6:16a KJV

Receiving strength and courage – "For by thee I have run through a troop; and by my God have I leaped over a wall." Psalm 18:29 KJV

Receiving encouragement - "Blessed are you when men hat you, and ostracize you, and insult you, and scorn your name as evil, for the sake of the Son of Man. Be glad in that day and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in heaven. For in the same way their fathers used to treat the prophets." Luke 6: 22-23

A loving and joyful marriage – "The voice of my beloved! behold, he cometh leaping upon the mountains, skipping upon the hills." Song of Solomon 2:8 (KJV)

A unique encounter with Jesus – "And it came to pass, that, when Elisabeth heard the salutation of Mary, the babe leaped in her womb." Luke 1:41 KJV

A miraculous healing – A lame man at the Beautiful Gate in the Temple hoped that Peter and John would give him alms. But Peter's short and powerful prayer, in the name of Jesus, gave him so much more: the ability to walk. "And he, *leaping* up stood, and, walked, and entered with them into the temple walking, and leaping, and praising God." Acts 3:8 KJV

Although we might not leap physically, as David did, we can leap in our hearts as God's blessings unfold in our lives this year. May we all experience many reasons to call 2024 our personal leap year!

O will you not accept this One, Who suffered thus for thee? Then peace, and rest, and joy are thine, throughout eternity. —Author unknown




