GUARANTEED FREEDOM - IN CHRIST

Dear Friends and Members,

In the United States we enjoy a level of freedom that is not found in many parts of the world. Each year on July 4th Americans celebrate that precious freedom and independence with barbecues, picnics, and family gatherings. Every Sunday and throughout the week, we get to worship God in the place of our choice because we live in a free society. There are no barred windows or doors in a free society, no censoring of God's Word or free speech, no secret police, and so on. We are so accustomed to our civil, physical, and personal freedoms that we sometimes take them for granted as if freedom is a guaranteed right forever. History shows otherwise, of course, that freedom can be taken away. Ronald Reagan was right when he said, "Freedom is never more than one generation away from extinction. We don't pass it on to our children in the bloodstream. It must be fought for, protected, and handed on for them to do the same, or one day we will spend our sunset years telling our children and our children's children what it was once like in the United States where men were free".

As followers of Jesus Christ, we know that civil and personal freedoms are blessings from God

and can be temporary. Yet they are secondary to the transcendent, spiritual freedom we have in Christ. "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the afflicted; He has sent me to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to captives, and freedom to prisoners." (Isaiah 61:1)

A person can possess all the civil and personal freedom the world has to offer but be spiritually enslaved. Sadly, most Americans are in the grip of spiritual bondage today; they are spiritually dead. On the other hand, as believers, we can be denied our secondary freedoms yet be spiritually free.

The Apostle Paul understood secondary freedoms. Paul's invoking of his Roman citizenship status led to his first face-to-face meeting with Caesar (Acts 25:11 - 12, 21) and his civil rights as a Roman citizen helped to acquit him of all charges against him. Yet, Paul was more concerned about our freedom in Christ than jail time:

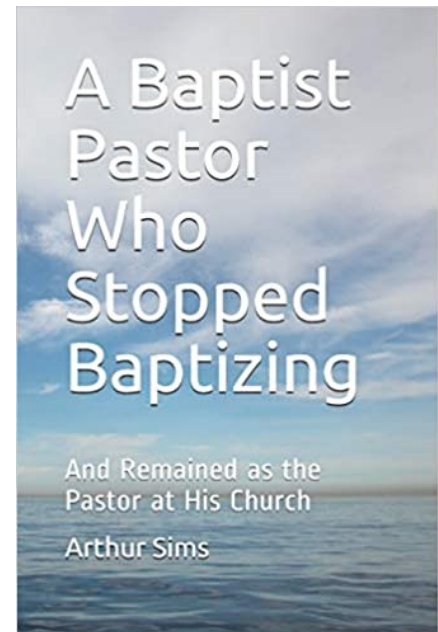
Please remember to check out Pastor Art Sims book, “A Baptist Pastor Who Stopped Baptizing” which is available at Amazon.com.
